SENIOR FAMILIES

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS, FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIP REMINDERS

- Check Application Portals Students should check their emails and application portal. Good news might be in your inbox.
- Update Naviance with Admission Decisions as students hear back from colleges under the "Colleges I'm Applying To" list in Naviance Student.
- Financial Aid check college application portals for financial aid and scholarship letter information. Most
 colleges will post online prior to mailing letters. Families should be in the process of or have already finished
 and submitted their FAFSA forms.
- Scholarships- Get serious about looking and applying for scholarships. Check Schoology and the Newsline.

FAFSA- WHAT HAPPENS AFTER YOU SUBMIT

- When you submit your completed 2024–25 FAFSA form, you'll get a confirmation email.
- This will include your estimated <u>Student Aid Index (SAI)</u> and estimated eligibility for Federal Pell Grants.
- We'll provide your FAFSA eligibility information to your school(s) and state in late January.
- Once your school(s) receive your FAFSA information, they will provide you with personalized aid information in the coming weeks.
- Until your school(s) and state receive your form, they won't be able to answer questions about your aid eligibility or status.
- You will receive an email when your FAFSA information has been sent to your selected schools and when you can access your FAFSA Submission Summary on StudentAid.gov.
- The FAFSA Submission Summary will provide your official SAI calculation and Federal Pell Grant eligibility.
- You can also check the status of your FAFSA form on StudentAid.gov in late January.

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON

STUDENTS WHO HAVE APPLIED TO THE UNIVERSITY OF OREGON

- Students, please make sure all documents are supplied to the U of O by February 15. This includes your Self-Reporting Academic Record for your first semester grades.
- Your application is considered incomplete without the SRAR completed.

KEEP UP YOUR GRADES! - WE WILL BE SENDING OUT MID-YEAR TRANSCRIPTS TO ALL COMMON APPLICATION COLLEGES THAT REQUIRE THEM ONCE SENIOR GRADES ARE COMPLETED.

• If you did not apply using the Common App and mid-year grades must be submitted to a college, please notify your counselor.

Slocum Scholarship cont.

- The Scholarship Program targets well-rounded high school seniors who plan to pursue a career in healthcare, health-related research, public or community health.
- The purpose of our Scholarship Program is to enable qualified students to pursue their educational goals. A one-time award of \$1,500 will be offered to the most competitive applicants. Selco Credit Union Scholarship

- If you are planning to attend an accredited two- or four-year college or university, you may be eligible for a \$2,500 SELCO Scholarship to help with tuition and other educational expenses. The 2024 application period will be open February 1 to March 31, 2024. Review the requirements listed below to see if you are eligible!
- Plan to attend a vocational school or an accredited two- or four-year college/university.
- Be a SELCO member or the immediate family member of a SELCO member. (SELCO employees and their immediate family members are not eligible.)
- Have not previously received a SELCO scholarship.
- Have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Prospective students are asked to apply online at <u>selco.org/scholarships</u>
