Your Student Portfolio Tells a Bigger Story that Universities and Employers Look At

- Special talents, achievements, and awards in a particular field, such as visual and performing arts, communications, or athletics
- Special interests and areas of intensive study, as well as exploration of other cultures
- Experiences that demonstrate unusual promise for leadership, such as significant community service, retreat program leadership, or exceptional participation in student organizations

A transcript is one page, it should show some of your knowledge, skills, and abilities, but there has to be more to YOU than one page.

Sustainability Self-Reflection

Forecasting courses is a search for BALANCE. When selecting courses, students should carefully consider what their lives will look like next school year. As students choose courses, they should consider not only their academic interests, but also such questions as:

- Will I have a job next school year?
- Will I have the opportunity to exercise?
- Do I plan to play a sport, audition for a play, go on retreats, or be in a club?
- How much sleep do I get right now?
- How much study and homework time will I need next year, when the material will be more complex and challenging in every course?
- What are my aspirations after high school?

On-Track to Graduate

3.1 GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Marist meets all of the academic requirements for a high school diploma in the state of Oregon. Marist requires 26 credits for graduation, and we offer a wide variety of challenging academic and elective courses. The following lists credits required for graduation from Marist:

Verify that you are on-track to graduate and look ahead to the credits you will need to fulfill in the coming school year.

Some courses it's clear what you are taking, like English and Theology, but take time to carefully consider the other options available to you, and even plan out what your Junior and Senior years may look like.

Any Credits to Remediate?

- You may need to double up on that class next year or the year after.
- Summer school or Online school


NOTE: You cannot transfer in any credits taken outside of Marist without prior approval. Check with your counselor if credits outside of Marist are a part of your plan.
